THE LEGEND OF THE GHOST OF THE TOWER OF LONDON

Anne Boleyn was Queen of England from 1533 to 1536. She was the second wife of Henry VIII , king of England.

Anne Boleyn was executed on 19th May 1536 in the Tower of London because her husband was tired of her and did not love her any more. A French man beheaded her with a sword. Her body and head were buried in the Chapel of St. Peter, next to the Tower Green.

The legend says that in 1864 a soldier saw a headless woman, Anne Boleyn's ghost, near the tower and he fell down in shock. A captain of the guard also saw her walking in the White Tower, wearing an elegant dress and holding her head. People say that Anne Boleyn's ghost still walks around the Tower of London and the place where she was buried.
